

The SASA Medium Term Plan 2008 – 2012 - Concept Overview:

The Medium Term Plan is a working document that calls for a greater productivity in the Ministry. It has a *blue print* to a more effective delivery of its objectives and is a *way forward* into the 21st century as a vehicle for change. The plan's overall objective is:

'To work towards building an organized, vibrant and effective student organization that will reflect professionalism in its conduct in preparing souls for the Second Advent whilst producing well informed and responsible citizens of this Nation (PNG).'

The Plan identifies five major Phases;

- i. Secure Land Title for the Project
- ii. Acquisition of a permanent Office
- iii. Erection of a Chaplaincy Residence
- iv. Attachment of a fulltime Chaplain who will coordinate the affairs of the Association and;
- v. Set-up Data base (improve Networking in the Ministry)

This project will ultimately see a fulltime Chaplaincy service in the provincial capital (Kundiawa) to effectively coordinate and monitor the Ministry operations. This will further boost its performance as it promotes maximum participations from a wider representation, maintaining a high level of communication at all levels, improved bottom-up and top-down coordination with an effective networking eventually revitalizing the spirit of Student Ministry in the Province as well as nationwide. The plan will also take a holistic approach in promoting more responsible, vibrant, morally sound and integral human capital development.

It will address issues like assets growing legs, inconsistencies in performances year-in and year-out, financial constraints, leadership performance rating, members code of conduct, and ultimately we are looking at doing away with the culture of fundraising. The project sustainability mechanism in the long run as projected has the viability of sustaining its operations from conventions to possible humanitarian and charitable ventures in the future.

This concept is a *brainchild* of SASA that sets a milestone in the history of student Ministry in Papua New Guinea which we are piloting and eventually will be shared with other sister Associations in the coming years after the outcome is measured. The concept as we have seen have the potential to impact and dynamically transform Simbu overnight which if adopted nationwide will see a huge transformation in the places where the student ministry steps foot on.

It is evident from Scriptures that God is a 'God of Order' and that administration and organization is paramount to His work. Before God lead Israel into the wilderness, he commended Moses to organize them before He can effectively lead them to the Canaan land. This has given sufficient light that unless the people of God organized itself it cannot become recipient to heaven's full blessings.
